With the learners at the center of education, the SDO Camarines Norte, led by SDS Nympha D. Guemo, intends to continue its flagship program - Project SERVE (Service with Efficacy using available Resources and observing proper Values for Excellence) which ended in 2022 after three years of successful implementation, under the new name beginning January 2023. The project is now dubbed PROJECT **SERVE PLUS**

In the memorandum issued by SDS Guemo on the very first day of office of this year, she pronounced that her banner project shall remain with the following identified activities as the PLUSes, namely: (1) putting up a division newsletter that will highlight the significant information, update and accomplishment of the SDO, (2) opening of additional integrated schools particularly to the far-flung areas or last mile schools, (3) giving updates and clarification on issuances and other significant information to the school staff and personnel via virtual activities called e-Konsulta, (4) support projects initiated by Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) and School Governance Operation Division (SGOD) that would address learning gaps and learning losses as part of to the Learning Recovery Program of the SDO, and (5) put us a one-stop shop office for the existing associations in SDO to facilitate association transactions.

When SDS Guemo took over as superintendent of DepEd Camarines Norte in 2019, she launched Project SERVE as her guidon, which was praised by the people in the field due to facilitated teachers' reclassification, transparent budgetary utilization at high rates, zero non-liquidation of cash advances, efficient use of available resources, and ease in office transactions.



LSA Trained in Partnership with Food for the Hungry

Sixty-seven (67) Learning Support Aides (LSA) underwent a three-day specialized training at the SDO Conference Hall last January 5-7, 2023 in partnership and collaboration with Food for the Hungry, a non-government organization dedicated in eradicating all forms of human poverty. The activity facilitated in by fourteen (14) FH staff, was intended to capacitate the LSAs effectively and efficiently in assisting teachers in delivering highquality educational outcomes that have been hampered by the COVID-19 crisis. The LSAs were introduced to the global and national contexts of learning insufficiency through the presentation of the present status of literacy and numeracy in the country, prepared to become acquainted with the SDO Camarines Norte's learning recovery and continuity programs, received technical input on best practices in addressing learning gaps, and gained competencies in teaching reading.

The 67 LSAs shall serve as a course multiplier for the first 172 LSAs hired by DepEd SDO Cam Norte under the Contract of Service, as specified in DepEd Order No. 32, s. 2020, subject to other existing policies, rules, and regulations. Their primary responsibilities include assisting the teacher with lesson preparation and delivery, as well as monitoring and tracking learners' progress and achievement.

SDS Nympha D. Guemo expressed gratitude on behalf of SDO Camarines Norte for the partnership extended by Food for the Hungry, a well-respected NGO, that is passionate about combating learning poverty.
