SDO-Camarines Norte forged a Memorandum of Agreement with LGU Panganiban last 25 January 2023 relative to what will be the 12th and 13th Integrated Schools to be created in the province of Camarines Norte under the leadership of SDS Nympha D. Guemo.

Said MOA signing was graced by Honorable Ariel M. Non, Mayor of Jose Panganiban, Schools Division Superintendent Nympha D. Guemo, Robinson Frilles, Nanet S. Sara, principals of Dahican Elementary School, and Regino A. Yet Elementary School, respectively, Engr. Julie Fe B. Pato, and Atty. Kimberly A. Israel.

Considering that education is an agent to alleviate, if not, eradicate poverty, by providing easy-access education to the locality, the said agreement is hoped to break the inter-generational cycle of poverty in the municipality in the long run and for its short-run benefits, the agreement is seen to generate additional jobs for the community, thus, LGU- Panganiban allots ₱2,000,000.00 initial budget for the structure of the envisioned Integrated Schools.

Chavez, EPS, gave techniques on Enhancing Appropriate Behavioral Skills for

They also gave emphasis on the goal of FTAD to strengthen the schools' divisions in managing the respective schools leading to the achievement of their performance outcomes with the end in view of providing relevant, timely, and appropriate technical assistance to schools' divisions through the coordination of all the units.

Other resource speakers provided inputs on the different topics focusing on Technical Assistance and Monitoring and Evaluation processes through a workshop to have a clear understanding of the methods of giving technical assistance which was then presented by the participants and resulted in the giving of feedback by the resource speakers which brought insights and exchanges of ideas about giving technical assistance and its importance in managing respective schools leading to the achievement of their performance outcomes.

In the closing part, SDS Nympha D. Guemo clarified issues and concerns concerning technical assistance to have a common understanding and goal to realize the target of the organization and in understanding the situation of the division, their needs, aspirations, plans, strengths, and weaknesses,

SDO Camarines Norte researchers reap international recognition

Exemplary performance and the burning passion of the researchers and coaches from the STE implementing schools namely Basud National High School and Vinzons Pilot High School proved that curiosity, analytical ability, determination, collaboration, and communication are among the best traits of researchers after winning the STEM Fair and Expo 2023 held on March 10, 2023, at Pullman Bangkok King Power Hotel in Bangkok, Thailand.

STEM Project Competition is a flagship program of the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Regional Centre for STEM Education (SEAMEO STEM-ED) designed to help and improve the problem-solving skills of youth by employing STEM-integrated knowledge.

Over 400 research works from ten (10) ASEAN member nations were screened, and thirty (30) projects were declared winners focusing on three categories, namely, (1) everyday life challenges, (2) industry challenges, and (3) community & school challenges, whose findings were presented to policymakers, researchers, and ministers during the said activity.

With over 400 applicants received during the application acceptance period (October 1, 2022 - January 31, 2023), SEAMEO STEM-ED and STEM Project Competition Judging Committee assured that all applicants were carefully reviewed with the utmost ethical practice.

Three (3) projects of the five (5) winners from the Philippines came from the Schools Division Office of Camarines Norte particularly from Basud National High School and Vinzons Pilot High School as shown on the next page.

Brigada Eskwela 2022 Best Implementing Schools garner SDO Camarines Norte Recognition

The truism that exemplifies volunteerism is shown in the recently conducted Search for Brigada Eskwela 2022 Best Implementing Schools, focused on the promotion of collaboration and resiliency in Basic Education.

Pursuant to the DepEd Memorandum No. 062, s.2022, SDO Camarines Norte launched its 2022 BRIGADA ESKWELA DIVISION KICK-OFF last August 11, 2022 in hybrid method and was live streamed via fb at DepEd Camarines Norte page while the in-person ceremony was conducted at San Francisco NHS, Talisay, Camarines Norte.

Prior to the Kick-Off ceremony, 2022 Brigada Eskwela Advocacy Campaign video contest has been conducted to encourage schools to showcase the talents of their learners and teachers in coming up with a campaign video to be used in marketing and advocacy activities while series of Virtual Coordinators' coordination meetings were conducted and dubbed as e-CoM to assist Coordinators in the implementation of Brigada Eskwela as well as Brigada Pagbasa.

The report on resources generated revealed SDO-Camarines Norte had accumulated ₱429,375,482.18 equivalent to \$2,617.25 per learner value based on the total number of enrolments of 164,056 learners of the Division.

As a result of forging strong parentship with LGUs, SDO Camarines Norte is assured of a continuous annual support from the seven (7) Municipalities by way of enactment of Municipal Ordinance providing financial support to Brigada Eswkela and five (5) Municipalities passed Resolution for the same purpose and raised ₱1,635,000.00 from among the Local Government Units.

Best Implementing Schools were categorized into (small, medium, large, mega) category and after thorough evaluation by the Division Evaluation and Validation Committee, results were announced in a Division Bulletin No. 010, series 2023 and as follows: For Small Category; 1st Balce ES and Caringo HS; 2nd Macolabo ES and Maximo Manarang HS; 3rd Melguiades Caldit ES and San Isidro Alcantara HS. For Medium Category, 1st Fundado ES and Fabrica HS; 2nd San Isidro ES (Talisay) and Eugenia M. Quintela MHS; 3rd Pandan ES and Gawad Kalinga HS. For Large Category, 1st F. Baldovino ES and San Francisco NHS; 2nd Parang ES and Talobatib NHS; 3rd Capalonga CS and Mercedes HS. For Mega Category 1st Labo ES and Paracale NHS; 2nd Jose Panganiban ES and Basud NHS; 3rd Vinzons Pilot ES and Vinzons Pilot

Aside from the usual preparation on physical aspect, different projects for Struggling Learners have been initiated and one of which is the Volunteers Capacitation Kiosk, to capacitate our BP Volunteers; use of Gadgets powered by solar energy for pupils in remote areas; Bahay-Aralan/Sulok-Aralan-converting a portion of student's house into a classroom; others called it Aralan sa Tahanan.

Brigada Eskwela 2022 implementation was made possible through the help of our major partners like Food for the Hungry Philippines, REBISCO (Republic Biscuit Corporation), One MERALCO Foundation, Nestle Philippines, ABC+, Commodore Jose S. Francisco Foundation Inc. (AHA Learning Center), Municipal and Barangay LGUs and other education partners.



ONE GOAL, ONE COMMUNITY. The successful implementation of Brigada Eskwela in SDO Camarines Norte is a testament to the power of community as many stakeholders came together to lend a hand in preparing schools for the upcoming school year.
