SDO Camarines Norte Conducts Information Caravan on DepEd Merit Selection Plan and Recruitment, Selection, and Appointment

The Schools Division Office (SD0) Camarines Norte recently conducted an information caravan on the DepEd Merit Selection Plan (MSP) and Recruitment, Selection, and Appointment (RSA) for eight settings in various districts of the SD0 as it aims to provide its personnel and education stakeholders with a better understanding of the policy changes along with the new rules in line with these vital human resources (HR) systems.

The Department of Education issued DO 007, s. 2023 (RSA Guidelines), on March 22, 2023, which establishes policy guidelines for a systematic and competence-based process of personnel selection, recruitment, and appointment that ensures hirings and retaining the right people for the right job at the right time, while strictly adhering to the principles of merit, competence, fitness, accountability, transparency, and equal opportunity, and (MCFATE) as outlined in DepEd MSP (DO 019, 2. 2022) where both the MSP and the RSA are critical in ensuring that the best and most qualified candidates are chosen for positions in the Department, leading to better teaching quality and better learning outcomes for students.

During the information caravan, participants who are school heads, non-teaching personnel, and selected master teachers to form the sub-committee in the hiring of teachers' entry-level positions had the opportunity to ask questions and clarify any concerns they may have with members of the Human Resource Merit and Selection Board (HRMPSB) as the latter explained the significance of MCFATE as the principles in the selection process and how points are allotted during the evaluative assessment of recruitment. The caravan was well-received and valued as an opportunity to learn not only about MSP and RSA but also about other HR systems.

According to Crestito M. Morcilla, SDO Camarines Norte Superintendent, "The information caravan is part of our commitment to disseminate essential information that would affect the operation of our human resource systems. We believe that by providing our people with a better understanding of the MSP and RSA processes, we can ensure that equal opportunity and transparency are accorded as we hire the best and most fit for the position in the Department."

Following the successful completion of the information caravan on the new MSP and RSA, a similar activity for teacher-applicants shall also be held to be announced at a later date.

The said activity was graced by ASDS Maria Flora T. Pandes, who represented SDS Crestito M. Morcilla. ASDS Pandes highlighted the importance of knowing the school site titling procedures as it will help secure the scarce land of DepEd.

Atty. Kimberly A. Israel discussed the different modes of acquiring school site ownership, Meanwhile, Engr. Julie Fe B. Pato, explained the procedures and requirements for school survey while, Ms. Nerissa A. Augusto of the Provincial Assessor talked about the procedures and requirements for tax declaration, tax mapping, and tax history.



PENRO representative, Engr. Joshua T. Mabeza pointed out the importance of determining ways to acquire school site thru special patent. Ma. Belinda Villagracia of the Land Registration Authority relayed the procedures and requirements for donation registration and land registration.

Bureau of Internal Revenue's representative Victoria V. Boholst talked about the procedures and requirements for donation registration and tax assessment. Finally, Luis S. Amatosa of the SDO-Accounting Unit discussed about the procedures and requirements for liquidation/reimbursement of school site.

The activity aims to provide necessary technical-know-how to the school heads in expediting the titling and surveying of the school site, and by extension, protecting the interest of DepEd.

EDUSALIKSIK: Seminar-Workshop for New Master Teachers as Trailblazers in Conquering Learning Losses and Gaps

and Research Section conducted the EDUSALIKSIK: 2-Day Seminar-Workshop Action/Basic Research Writing for New Master Teachers with the theme "MT's: Trailblazers in Conquering Learning Losses and Gaps" on March 18, 2023, and April I, 2023. This seminar-workshop was an essential activity that aimed to equip the new master teachers of SDO Camarines Norte with technical knowledge in writing action/basic research. Specifically, it was expected that the participants should be able to: (a) be updated with the Research Management Guidelines and Agenda; Research (b) familiarize themselves with and understand the parts, and template of writing Action/Basic Research; (c) prepare and write their own research proposal; and (d) appreciate the importance of research and its outputs in facing the challenges to education. Through this seminar, attendees gained a deeper understanding of how to write an Action/Basic Research Proposal and Completion Report.

The seminar-workshop commenced with Research Management Guidelines and the SDO Research Agenda discussed by PSDS Glenda N. Rito. Followed by the formulation of Action Research Title and Objectives explained by EPS Noel V. Ibis. In the afternoon, topics about writing Context and Rationale, and Literature Review were imparted by Bernie C. Aremado, TIII of Don Tomas Elementary School, and Proposed Innovation, Intervention, and Strategy was shared by Wilson Angel H. Villarin, HTIII of Camarines Norte National High School.

The continuation of the seminar-workshop was conducted on April I, 2023, where four resource speakers shared their expertise on the topics: Action Research Methods discussed by SEPS Blesilda A. Necio, Action Research Work Plan and Timelines, and Cost Estimates shared by Allan P. Siazon, Plll of M. Hebrado Elementary School. Likewise, Discussion of Results and Reflection was imparted by Rhoderick M. Barreto, Pl of S. Basilio Elementary School, and Plans for Dissemination and Utilization and an Action Plan were discussed by Jason S. Napa, School Head of Lalawigan National High School.

The resource speakers provided practical tips and examples to help attendees master the art of writing and formatting their research papers. The resource speakers also emphasized the significance of data analysis in the research process and taught the attendees various techniques for analyzing data. This session helped the participants understand how to accurately and effectively interpret the data, which is crucial to generating valid research results. Attendees had a chance to gain a deeper understanding of the different components of an action/basic research paper and their respective roles. The participants appreciated the value of a well-structured research paper.

The closing program was conducted after the eight sessions. ASDS Maria Flora T. Pandes gave her inspirational message and challenged the Master Teachers to conquer the learning losses and gaps. She also explained the importance of research in helping our learners and as the basis for formulating policies. In conclusion, the participants had an opportunity to improve their research writing skills and engage with other professionals in their field. Ultimately, the seminar-workshop equipped the attendees with the knowledge and skills necessary to produce high-quality research papers that will contribute to the advancement of knowledge in their respective disciplines.
